

#### **AMERICAN FILM SHOWCASE UNVEILS YEAR 5 SLATE**

# 49 FICTION FEATURES, DOCUMENTARY FEATURES AND DOCUMENTARY SHORTS WERE SELECTED FOR THIS YEAR'S PREMIERE U.S. STATE DEPARTMENT FILM TOURING PROGRAM

LOS ANGELES (May 25, 2016)— Today the American Film Showcase (AFS), the premiere film diplomacy program of the U.S. Department of State's Bureau of Educational and Cultural Affairs (ECA), and produced by the USC School of Cinematic Arts (SCA), unveiled the official 2016-2017 film slate. The 2016-2017 film diplomacy initiative will feature a diverse slate of fiction features, documentary features and documentary shorts that will screen from September 1, 2016 - August 31, 2017. U.S. Embassies will use the film slate for cultural programming around the world. The American Film Showcase will send selected filmmakers on 7-10 day international tours to conduct special screenings, presentations, and participate in local festivals. Each of the AFS programs is designed to spark dialogue and empower local communities to tell their own stories. As in years past, films will screen in over 40 different countries such as: Benin, Mongolia, Belarus, Algeria, Jordan, Peru, Egypt, India, Zimbabwe, and Kazakhstan.

"This year's collection of films will offer a nuanced glimpse of life in America to international audiences who might not have access to films beyond Hollywood blockbusters. Every film in the program will provide US embassies an engaging tool to promote dialogue around a relevant societal issue," said Rachel Gandin Mark, Program Director.

The slate this year includes 33 feature documentaries, 10 documentary shorts, and 5 fiction feature films. Films include *Batkid Begins, Beyond The Lights, Twinsters,* and *The Spectacular Now.* 51% of selected films this year are directed by women.
